Canal Basin Park Field Trips for Kids Form for Spring 2024

INTRODUCTION

Thank you for your interest in Canal Basin Park Field Trips for Kids, a subset of the **Hollidaysburg Heritage Guided Tours** (HHGT).

BACKGROUND

Field trips take place at Canal Basin Park in Hollidaysburg, PA and last about **two hours**, with 60-90 minutes of interactive instruction. During the field trip, students will visit several tour guide stations focused on **historic Hollidaysburg's location**, **transportation**, **growth**, **commerce**, **people** and **daily life** as they relate to the park and the Reiser House (museum). Students will complete an **Anticipation Guide** before the field trip and **Reflection Paper** after the tour, which works well for **elementary students** but can be modified for **any age or grade level** because our tour guides are teachers, librarians, and community organizers. The tour is free.

FYI

Canal Basin Park, which turned 20 years old in April 2022, does NOT have a lot of shade, tables or benches. Canal Basin Park DOES have: restrooms beside the pavilion/amphitheater, a wheelchair-accessible porta potty beside the Reiser House and a restroom in the Reiser House. Buses can park at the "official" Canal Basin Park entrance located at 300ish Bedford Street or behind Blair Mill Outlets at 101 Canal Street. Folks on the field trip should wear/bring:

- Weather-appropriate play clothes and play shoes
- A hat
- Sunglasses
- Sunscreen
- Water
- Predetermined student groups, which will depend upon the number of tour guides available
- A First Aid Kit
- Necessary medications
- Emergency Contact Information
- o Parent/Guardian permission forms with photo releases
- Picnic blankets, optional for eating lunch at the park
- Garbage bags, optional if eating lunch at the park

MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION

The actual and <u>virtual</u> **Allegheny Portage Railroad National Historic Site** has many resources related to Hollidaysburg's history.

NatureWorks Park is less than a mile from Canal Basin Park. Feel free to contact the <u>Blair County Conservation</u> <u>District</u> to organize a corresponding tour, talk or picnic there. In fact, BCCD used to host a Water Festival in the spring. Perhaps you could schedule both field trips on the same day!

Chimney Rocks Park is less than a mile away. Consider adding that vista to your field trip agenda.

The Everett Railroad has a train station/depot beside Canal Basin Park. Visit their website for more information.

The **Alto Model Train Museum** at 1117 9th Avenue in Altoona has eleven train displays that your students may enjoy seeing. The museum is open every Saturday from 10-2 and is across the street from the <u>Railroaders</u> **Memorial Museum** and only a few miles from the <u>Horseshoe Curve</u>. All are local gems!

Trips to <u>Fort Roberdeau</u> and <u>Baker Mansion</u> would also enhance your students' understanding of Blair County history.
