Canal Basin Park Tours for Kids (Spring 2025)

INTRODUCTION

Are you interested in **Canal Basin Park Tours for Kids**, an offering of the **Hollidaysburg Heritage Guided Tours** (HHGT) and the **Hollidaysburg Area Public Library**? If so, read on or visit our **website**: https://hollidaysburglibrary.org/hhgtours/.

EXPLANATION

Tours are free, take place at Canal Basin Park in Hollidaysburg, PA and include 60-90 minutes of interactive instruction. During the tour/field trip, students will visit several tour guide stations focused on historic Hollidaysburg's location, transportation, growth, commerce, people and daily life as they relate to the park and the Reiser House (museum). Tours work well for elementary students but can be modified for any age or grade level. Before the field trip, teachers, parents and guardians can utilize local history materials at https://sites.psu.edu/canalcurriculum/ and show the first fourteen minutes of "The History of the Allegheny Ridge" video posted on YouTube. On the day of the field trip, students can eat lunch at the park and enjoy free play.

<u>F.Y.I.</u>

Canal Basin Park, which turned 20 years old in April 2022, does NOT have a lot of shade, tables or benches. Canal Basin Park DOES have restrooms beside the pavilion/amphitheater and a restroom in the Reiser House. Buses, vans and cars can park "across the footbridge" at the "official" Canal Basin Park entrance located at 300ish Bedford Street or behind Blair Mill Outlets at 101 Canal Street. Most groups spend a total of 2 to 2.5 hours at the park, weather depending, so attendees should wear/bring:

- o Weather-appropriate play clothes and play shoes
- o A hat
- o Sunglasses
- o Sunscreen
- o Water
- o Predetermined student groups, which depend upon the number of tour guides available
- o A First Aid Kit
- o Necessary medications
- o Emergency Contact Information
- o Parent/Guardian permission forms (with photo releases)
- o Picnic blankets, optional if eating lunch at the park
- o Garbage bags, optional if eating lunch at the park

TOUR DATES

Tours run on Monday mornings (with rain dates on Thursday mornings of the same week). Tours are scheduled on a first come, first served basis. (Depending on numbers, multiple groups may be scheduled for the same tour time.)

OTHER FIELD TRIP IDEAS

The actual and <u>virtual</u> **Allegheny Portage Railroad National Historic Site** has many resources related to Hollidaysburg's history.

NatureWorks Park is less than a mile from Canal Basin Park. Feel free to contact the <u>Blair County</u> Conservation District to organize a corresponding tour, talk or picnic there.

Chimney Rocks Park is less than a mile away. Consider adding that vista to your field trip agenda.

The Everett Railroad has a train station/depot beside Canal Basin Park. Visit <u>their website</u> for more information.

The **Alto Model Train Museum** at 1117 9th Avenue in Altoona has eleven train displays that your students may enjoy seeing. The museum is open every Saturday from 10-2 and is across the street from the **Railroaders Memorial Museum** and only a few miles from the **Horseshoe Curve**. All are local gems!

Trips to <u>Fort Roberdeau</u> and <u>Baker Mansion</u> would also enhance your students' understanding of Blair County history.
